FRESHMEN ADMISSION

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Check out the different ways you can be qualified to attend NSU!

- » ACT 20 (Composite, no writing) OR SAT 1030 (EMRW + M) OR
- » 2.7 GPA (cumulative, unweighted) & Top 50% of class OR
- » 2.7 Core GPA in 15 classes required for college entry

CORE REQUIREMENTS

For admissions consideration, students must complete the following 15 units while in High School:

- » English (4 units)
- » Mathematics (3 units)
- » Laboratory Science (3 units)
- » History and Citizenship Skills (3 units)
- » Other (2 units)

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Official transcripts can be mailed or sent electronically.

- » Official high school transcript
- » ACT/SAT scores (Not required if over the age of 23)
- » Official final high school transcript once graduated

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

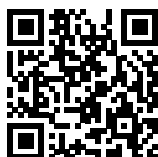

- » 24 - 30 credit hours | 1.7 GPA (cumulative)
- » 30+ credit hours | 2.0 GPA (cumulative)

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Official transcripts can be mailed or sent electronically.

- » Official college/university transcripts from all institutions attended
- » Official high school transcript (if fewer than 24 credit hours post high school not including developmental courses)
- » ACT/SAT scored (if fewer than 24 credit hours post high school not including developmental courses and if age is under 23)

In-State Incoming Freshmen are automatically considered for Freshmen General Scholarships when they complete their admission application. Students admitted before Feb. 1 will be offered the highest scholarship listed in the chart based on their qualifications. Students admitted after Feb. 1 will be awarded if funding is available.

NSU AUTOMATIC FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Must be Oklahoma resident and admitted to NSU by deadline listed in order to qualify.

EARLY FRESHMEN DEADLINE: Dec. 1

Want an early scholarship decision? Students who have been regularly admitted by Dec. 1 and are eligible for an Automatic Freshman Scholarship will receive a scholarship offer by the end of December.

REGULAR FRESHMEN DEADLINE: Feb. 1

Students who have been regularly admitted by Feb. 1 and are eligible for an Automatic Freshman Scholarship will receive a scholarship offer by the end of February.

NSU FRESHMEN HONORS & PLC SCHOLARSHIPS

Must be an Oklahoma resident to qualify, with the exception of the Northeastern Honors Scholars scholarship. Students must also be admitted to NSU and apply for scholarships by the deadline in order to be considered.

FRESHMEN HONORS SCHOLARSHIPS - Deadline: Feb. 1

Academically-talented incoming freshmen can apply for NSU's Honors Program. Honors Program students work with distinguished faculty members in enhanced courses as well as pursue independent research.

The President's Leadership Class is a carefully selected group of incoming freshmen with unique leadership capabilities and a passion for community service.

OUT-OF-STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Not a resident of Oklahoma? There are several scholarship opportunities for you!

Spring Semester Deadline: Jan. 1

Summer/Fall Semester Deadline: Aug. 1

QUAD STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

This award is available to incoming freshman and transfer undergraduate students from Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, or Texas that meet regular admission requirements.

- » Our Quad State Scholarship program waives 100% of non-resident tuition when living on campus. Students are still responsible for the in-state tuition costs.
- » Legacy students whose parent, grandparent, or sibling earned a bachelor's or master's degree from NSU may receive the same benefits without the on-campus living requirement.

TRIBAL HERITAGE SCHOLARSHIP

This award is available to students from states other than Oklahoma that meet regular admission requirements and are a member of a federally recognized tribe.

- » Our Tribal Heritage Scholarship program waives 100% of non-resident tuition. Students are still responsible for the in-state tuition costs.

NON-RESIDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

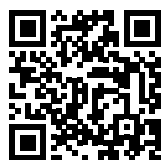
This award is available to students who are not residents of Oklahoma, Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, or Texas that live on campus and meet regular admission requirements.

- » Our Non-Resident Scholarship program waives 50% of non-resident tuition. Students are still responsible for the remaining non-resident portion as well as the in-state tuition costs.
- » Incoming freshmen that have a minimum 3.0 unweighted GPA and a 25 composite ACT score may be eligible for the non-resident scholarship.
- » Transfer students that have a minimum 2.75 GPA may be eligible for the non-resident scholarship.
- » Legacy students whose parent, grandparent, or sibling earned a bachelor's or master's degree from NSU may receive the same benefits without the on-campus living requirement.

FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

FRESHMAN DEADLINE: March 1 TRANSFER DEADLINE: May 1

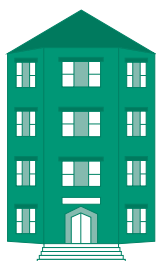

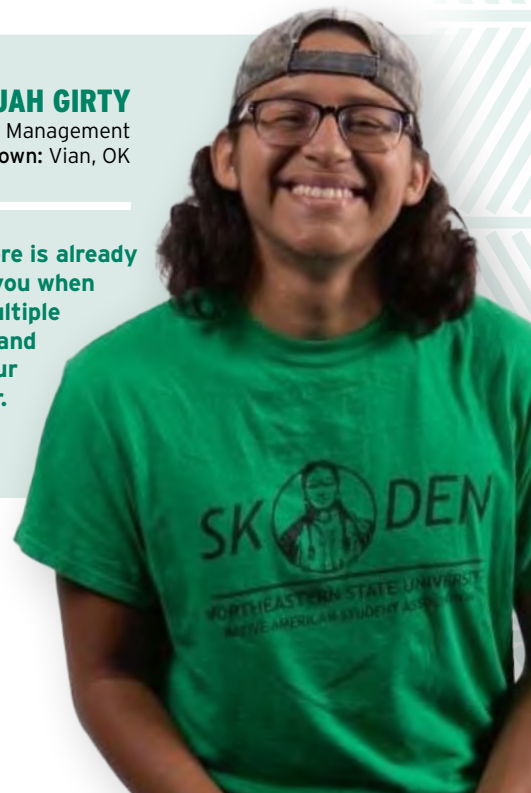

HOW TO APPLY

Review of applications for Fall '23 begins Sept. 1, 2022. Applications accepted on a rolling basis through Aug. 1, 2023.

- » Complete the NSU application at: Apply.nsuok.edu
- » Create an account with a personal email address the first time you log in
- » Submit your application
- » Pay the \$25 non-refundable application fee
