Admission Requirements

- * An earned bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university, with an undergraduate GPA of 2.5 overall, 2.75 GPA in last 60 hours of undergraduate.
- * Official Transcripts.
- * All master's degree candidates must take one of the following entrance exam tests–MAT, GRE, or GMAT before the close of the first semester of enrollment in graduate studies. The degree program being pursued determines the test to be taken and the minimum score that is required.
- * Proof of citizenship for a U.S. citizen born outside of the United States and for a resident alien. An international applicant for whom English was the first language and is the spoken language in the home must sign a statement to that affect.
- * TOEFL (for international student See International Student Graduate Application packet.)

TEACH Grant:

The TEACH grant provides up to \$3,900 a year for two years to graduate students who are completing a NSU Master's degree in...

...and who agree to teach full time for at least four years, within eight years from degree completion, in a school serving low-income students in a high need field (Title I, school).
