

COSTS FOR 2020-2021 (OUT-OF-STATE UNDERGRADUATE TUITION)




FINANCIAL AID

In 2018-2019, NSU awarded over \$71 million in financial assistance in the form of scholarships, grants, part-time work, tuition waivers and education loans.



FALL 2019 (OUT-OF-STATE





QUAD STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Incoming undergraduate students from Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, or Texas that meet regular admission requirements (not admitted alternatively or on probation) and live on campus, may be eligible for a scholarship waiving 100% of their nonresident tuition. Nonresident tuition is \$280 per hour, in addition to in-state tuition. Students are still responsible for paying in-state tuition. This program waives only the nonresident portion. Interested students must complete a general scholarship application by August 2, 2021.

Legacy students may be eligible to receive nonresident tuition waiver scholarships without the on-campus living requirement. Legacy students are defined as students whose parent and/or grandparent earned a bachelor's or master's degree from NSU, and will be verified with the NSU Alumni Association.

OUT OF STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Incoming non-resident students who are not residents of Oklahoma, Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, or Texas are also eligible for non-resident scholarships.

Incoming freshmen that live on campus and have a minimum 3.0 unweighted GPA and a 25 composite ACT score may be eligible for a scholarship waiving 50% of their nonresident tuition.

Transfer students that live on campus and have a minimum 2.75 GPA may be eligible for a scholarship waiving 50% of their nonresident tuition.

Nonresident tuition is \$280 per hour, in addition to in-state tuition. Students are still responsible for paying in-state tuition. This program waives only a percentage of the nonresident portion. Interested students must complete a general scholarship application by August 2, 2021.

TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS:

NSU awards scholarships to incoming freshmen, transfer students, current students and graduate students. The deadlines are as follows:

TUITION WAIVERS:

NSU awarded over \$6 million in tuition waivers last year! This scholarship waives a specified amount of a student's tuition costs. Fees are charged separately from tuition, and are therefore not covered by this type of award.

HOUSING WAIVERS:

This scholarship waives a specified amount of a student's on campus housing costs.

FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS:

The Foundation awarded \$875,101 in scholarships last year! These scholarships, including the Alumni Legacy Scholarship, are privately funded awards from NSU's Foundation. The money from these awards can apply towards any charges on a student's account.

OUTSIDE SCHOLARSHIPS:

Money that comes from outside of NSU can be awarded in many different ways. Those donors have control over the way in which their money is applied, and NSU will apply the funding accordingly.
